AIRPORT TO CITY CENTER:

Seville Airport is about 10 km from the city center. You have several transport options:

- Taxi/Uber: A 15-20 minute ride to the city center, costing around €20-25. Uber is usually cheaper than the taxi.
- Bus: The EA (Especial Aeropuerto) bus runs every 30 minutes and takes about 35 minutes and will leave you at Santa Justa train station. It costs €4.

TRANSPORT IN SEVILLE:

Walking: Seville's city center is compact, and walking is the best way to explore. Most attractions are within walking distance of each other.

- Public Transport: Bus. Single tickets cost around €1.40.
- Bicycles/Scooters: You can rent bikes or e-scooters to get around. Seville is quite bike-friendly.

WHERE TO STAY:

Everywhere you look in the city center, you'll find lovely places and neighborhoods to stay. Here are a few areas we recommend:

- Santa Cruz: The historic Jewish quarter with narrow streets, charming squares, and easy access to major monuments and tourist points.
- El Arenal: Close to the river and perfect for tapas bars and flamenco.
- Triana: On the other side of the Guadalquivir River, known for its unique vibe and local atmosphere.
- La campana: Close to shopping, restaurants, and cultural landmarks.

WHAT TO SEE:

Seville is a city full of history, culture, and stunning architecture. Here are some must-see landmarks and places to explore during your visit:

- Alcázar of Seville: A stunning royal palace with beautiful gardens, and a must-see UNESCO World Heritage site.
- The Cathedral & Giralda Tower: The largest Gothic cathedral in the world. You can climb to the top of the Giralda Tower for panoramic views of the city.



- Plaza de España: A beautiful semicircular plaza built for the Ibero-American Exposition of 1929, located in María Luisa Park.
- The park itself is perfect for a romantic stroll. There are also emblematic buildings and museums within the park.
- Metropol Parasol (Setas de Sevilla): A modern wooden structure with a fantastic viewpoint over the city.
- Torre del Oro: A historic tower by the river housing a maritime museum.
- Casa de Pilatos: A beautiful palace with stunning architecture and gardens.
- River Guadalquivir: A lovely walk along the river, with plenty of spots to enjoy a drink.
- Get lost in Barrio de Santa Cruz: Wander through narrow streets filled with small shops, cafés, and restaurants.
- Plaza de Toros: This is the famous bullring. Even if you're not interested in bullfighting, the bullring is a historic monument worth seeing. It is located right next to the Torre del Oro.
- Walk along Avenida de la Constitución and Calle San Fernando: This walk can end at the Fábrica de Tabaco, an old tobacco factory that now serves as a university.
- Visit the churches: Seville is full of beautiful churches, and it's worth going inside some of them. A particularly beautiful one is the Church of El Salvador. After visiting, enjoy a caña (small beer) at one of the bars across from the church.

WHERE TO EAT:

Here are some places with a variety of prices and types of restaurants. Feel free to ask if you are interested in a specific dish or price range.

- El Rinconcillo: It is a must because it is close to the church and also, THE OLDEST TALAS bar in Spain, offering a traditional Andalusian atmosphere.

Seville offers a variety of bars and terraces where you can have fun and enjoy a drink, from traditional sherry bars to rooftop spots with amazing views. Here are some top recommendations:

- El Garlochí: A unique bar in the Alfalfa neighborhood with a quirky atmosphere and a great selection of drinks. (Cash only)
- La Terraza de EME: A rooftop bar with nice views of the Seville Cathedral and Giralda Tower—ideal for sunset cocktails. (A bit pricey)
- Hotel Doña María: Enjoy drinks on the rooftop terrace with views of the city.
- El Arenal: fully of bar to have beers and drinks
- Capitol: It is a café & cocktail bar located in the heart of historic Seville, in Plaza Nueva, the square where the Seville City Hall is situated.

WHERE IS THE PARTY:

And our final recommendation for those who want to keep the party going after the big wedding day!

- El Arenal: This area is full of pubs for drinks. Clubs like O'clock, Groucho, and Mari Mandona play reggaeton music. On Arfe Street, you can enjoy drinks while listening to live flamenco performances.
- Alfalfa & Calle Betis: These neighborhoods offer a mix of lively bars, clubs, and small dance venues.
- La Carbonería: A popular spot for live flamenco music, especially in the evenings, with a vibrant atmosphere.
- Peña Flamenca: For a more traditional and authentic flamenco experience, visit one of Seville's dedicated flamenco venues.
